How these figures are built

SCOV1 2024 (statewide constitutional offices): 50.5% D → District's Natural Lean D +1.0

SLVI 2024 (the State Senate race itself): 52.5% D → 2024 Result D +5.0

SCOV1 is the State Constitutional Office Voting Index; SLVI is the State Legislative Voting Index. Doe's Edge as the Incumbent (~4 pts) is the gap between them (SLVI minus SCOV1 = 2.0 points) - how far Doe runs ahead of a generic Democrat - and the District Dem Share tile is whether that gap narrows or widens over time. The 2024 Result is the State Senate race margin you know from this race; the Natural Lean is the district's underlying partisanship once the incumbent's personal vote is removed, which is why the two differ.

Jane Doe holds a seat that already leans Democratic. The 2024 result (D +5.0) runs about 4 points ahead of the district's underlying lean - a personal edge that leaves with the incumbent.

Democrats hold a 680-registrant edge, and the roll is trending toward the Democrats at about 88 net registrants a year - a forward signal the vote history alone does not show.

What this means for your campaign

- An open seat here stays Democratic-favored - the personal edge leaves with Doe, and the underlying lean does not.
- Democratic votes cluster in one precinct (20-07, 65% Democratic). 11 of 26 precincts are true tossups; the rest lean solidly Republican.

Do this next

Running as the Democrat

Turn out 20-07 first, then work 14-04 and 14-08 - your best mix of favorable numbers and size.

Running as the Republican

Protect 36-08, 20-06, and 20-09 first - your strongest ground to hold.

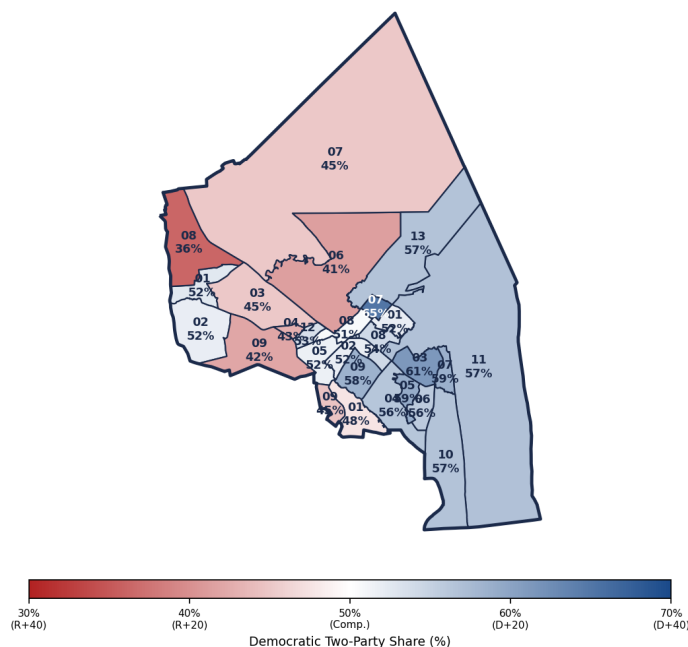

What these labels mean

Turn out your voters — already on your side - make sure they actually vote.

Persuade — genuinely up for grabs - win them with your message.

Turn out + persuade — a mix - turn out your own supporters and work the persuadables.

“Share” = this precinct's portion of all votes cast in the district in 2024 - a measure of size, not lean. Top precincts shown; full ranked lists are in the standard brief.
